Happy Fall Y'all!

September was a buzz with activity at the museum, and part of me can't believe October is already here! The museum's month started with a bang, with a day full of activities for both the museum and myself. From the Historical Commission visit to Burk, to Art Walk, and Texoma Gives, I was exhausted but happy at the end of the day! We raised \$3775 this year, and I couldn't be more proud of our team or our wonderful supporters!

On September 10th, I flew out of Wichita Regional (which, if you haven't had a chance... is truly a wonderful airport!) to Mobile, Alabama, to attend the 2024 American Association of State & Local History (AASLH) National Conference. It was a wonderful experience packed from bell to bell with professional development and networking opportunities. I learned so much and connected with industry leaders from across the country and the week allowed me to dive deep into museum best practices and the expanded knowledge in the post-COVID world. I also learned that you can walk nearly two miles, bow to stern, inside the tourable space of the Battleship USS Alabama!

For news you'll hear here first, I am happy to share that we have booked the first major temporary exhibit for 2025 and we have now officially entered the planning stage (pun absolutely intended!). The team at Backdoor Theatre will be working with our curatorial staff and myself on creating "*Curtain Call: Celebrating the History of Backdoor Theatre*", which will run in Harvey Hall from May 22nd – August 16th. The

team at Backdoor will work to produce a video to accompany the exhibit while supplying costumes & other artifacts for the exhibit. Once the run is complete, most artifacts and displays will move to their permanent home at Backdoor. Some will remain with the museum and be the foundation for the future Arts in North Texas permanent exhibit.

Lastly, I wanted to say a very big thank you to our friends at the Summerlee Foundation for the award of our \$5,000 Living History of North Texas project grant. Additionally, we received word of our 2025 Wichita Falls Alliance for Arts & Culture (WFAAC) grant for \$8,250! Support from foundations like Summerlee and organizations like the WFAAC has been instrumental in our success as a museum and cultural institution for the past 24 years.


As we move into the final quarter of 2024, I look forward to celebrations ahead for our wonderful institution, and I invite you all to be involved in our Silver Anniversary year!

WFAAC - The Legends Project

THE LEGENDS PROJECT



The Wichita Falls Alliance for Arts and Culture will dedicate a bronze sculpture of the late Charlye O. Farris as part of "The Legends Project," an effort to honor North Texas legends and trailblazers.

Farris holds the distinction of becoming the first African-American woman licensed to practice law in Texas, the first African-American attorney, male or female, in Wichita County, and the first African-American to serve as a judge in the South since Reconstruction.

Scheduled for Saturday, October 26th at 10:30 am, the event will take place on the lawn of the Wichita County Courthouse.




